### Cruise America

Cruise America has 24 rental depots spread across the United States including Alaska. It offers three types of vehicle: the compact is 19 ft and designed especially for the European market. Smaller than the average motorhome, it is designed to accommodate three people. Standard models are between 23 and 25 ft long and large models are between 28 to 30 ft long.



### El Monte RV

El Monte has 15 rental depots spread across America in all the major gateways. They offer a range of vehicles starting at the 22 ft unit, with 25, 28 and 31 ft units with slideouts all the way up to the A-Class motorhome, a real home on wheels. El Monte can provide airport transfers for a small fee.

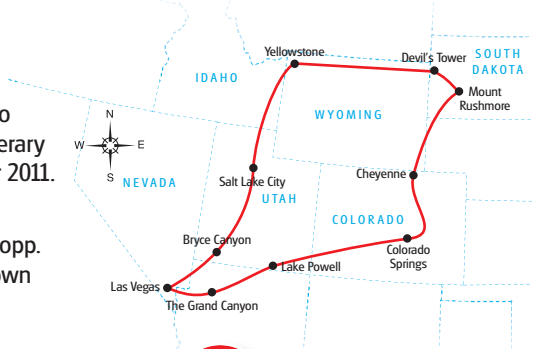

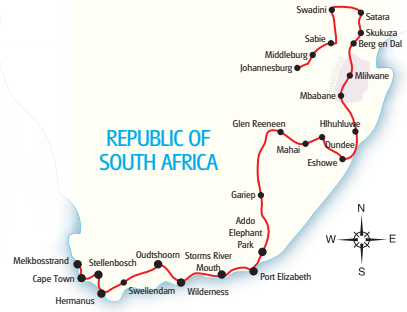
