Introduction

Loch Ness Shores campsite nestles on the southern shore of Loch Ness, in the heart of the Scottish Highlands. It is in the tranquil village of Foyers, 20 miles from the Highland capital of Inverness. A stunning campsite that offers breath-taking scenery right on the banks of Loch Ness. Return to nature with panoramic views of the loch and the mountains beyond, with a backdrop of woodlands, forestry and the most spectacular flora and fauna.

One of only a few places with easy access to the shore around Loch Ness, this site provides an opportunity to canoe, kayak or launch small boats, fish for trout and salmon or if prefer hire a boat and gillie locally. The Great Glen Canoe Trail passes the site, which provides rest for canoeist and kayaks to stay overnight, get a hot shower and stock up on provisions.

The 120-pitch site is offers a mixture of fully serviced, hardstanding, grass with electric and grass only pitches. The site also benefits from having Camping Pods suitable for sleeping up to 5 people. The site is across two levels with the Reception, Shop, Cafe, Laundry and Facilities Block at level one. If you have any difficulty walking, we recommend that you request a pitch on the lower level.

Mobile signal is mixed with Vodafone and O2 being very poor. BT, 3 and EE are the preferred network.

Television signal is good.

No site WiFi.

Your Arrival on Site

The earliest arrival time on site is strictly 2pm.

Approach surface is tarmac. The Site is off the B852 which is a single-track road with many passing places. If you are using a SatNav to reach us, please be aware that it may try to direct you onto roads that are not suitable for your vehicle. The best way to find us is using a road map and our directions. Please use passing places to allow other traffic to overtake when approaching the site by vehicle. As a courtesy to other road users, 2 hours has been allowed between departures and arrivals. Please do not approach the site before 2 p.m.

Arrival surface is gravel.



There is an automatic barrier with keypad number code. Visitor parking is available in the lower carpark.

There is no designated accessible parking.

There is a bus stop 100m from site, buses run Monday to Saturday towards Inverness only. At Inverness bus station there are buses to other destinations.

There is a railway station at Inverness, 20 miles from site.

Accessible taxis can be booked in advance on 01463 800069 (Inverness Taxi Service).

The earliest arrival time on site is strictly 2pm.

Your Check In

The Reception and Shop is the building on the right as you drive in and just ahead of the barrier.

The Reception is clearly signed.

Access to Reception and Shop is level.

There is a double doorway with a shallow ridge at the bottom and the doors open outward. The floor space is free from clutter and there is turning room for wheelchairs.

Reception and Shop opening times will be displayed on the door.

The latest assisted pitching is 8pm. Campers may self-pitch after this time up until 11pm - instructions for this are on the outside of the Reception building.

Staff are not on duty after 8.00 pm but an emergency telephone number is provided for blue light emergencies after this time. This phone number can be found printed on your Site Welcome Leaflet.

Details of local hospitals, doctors, dentists and vets can be found in the Reception, outside the Facilities Block and in the Site Welcome Leaflet.

Your Pitch

The Fully Serviced pitches are gravel with a wooden border indicating your allocated area. They are located on the upper level with the exception of 2 which are available to book direct with the site. The 2 on the lower level have easy access to the Facilities Block.

The Hardstanding pitches are gravel with a wooden border indicating your allocated area. These are on the upper and lower level.

Grass with Electric pitches are either marked with a wooden frame or painted markings. With the exception of 4 pitches these are all located on the upper level. There are two sloping small grass with electric pitches where chocks are required.

Grass pitches without electric are located at the top of the site. Backpackers have a dedicated area on the lower level.

Campers can park on their pitch. There is a limit of 1 car per pitch.

Each electric bollard has a tap on the back of it.



Travelling around site

All site roads are gravel. There is a speed limit around the site of 5 mph.

There is low level bollard lighting around the site. A torch is recommended when walking around the site at night.

The Facility Block and Dishwash Area

The area leading to the Facility Block is slabbed. There are steps and a ramp.

There are 9 sinks for dishwashing, the taps are screw type.

The sinks in the Facilities Block have push button taps.

The showers are twist operated. There are no steps in the showers. There is a wall-mounted seat in three of the shower cubicles.

The Facility Block and access are well lit at night.

There is turning room in the main Facilities Block for wheelchairs. There are 2 accessible cubicles within the main block.

Assistance dogs are permitted in the Facility Block.

The Accessible Facilities

There is flat level access leading to the Accessible Facilities, which is located on the east side of the main Facility Block, having its own door opening directly onto the pathway. There are no handrails leading to the facility.

The door has a 900 mm opening width and opens outwards. The facilities are open to all. There is a pull handle on the door.

The taps are lever type.

The shower is open access, flat wet room style with no tray to step into. The shower has two grab rails and a pull-down seat, capable of taking a weight up to 95 kgs. It is twist operated and the shower head is height adjustable.

The toilet has a drop-down handrail on the right and a fixed handrail on the left. The toilet has a larger flush handle. There is transfer space on the right of the toilet when handrail is lifted. There is a hand towel dispenser, hairdryer and the washbasin can be reached from the toilet.

The floor is non-slip.

There is an emergency cord by the toilet that can be reached from the floor. The alarm can be heard from the outside the building.

Assistance dogs are permitted in the Accessible Facilities.



Laundry

The Laundry is located at the rear of the Facilities Block and has a flat slabbed path to access it. There are no handrails leading to the laundry area. There is wheelchair turning room in the laundry. The door to the laundry area opens outwards.

The taps are screw type.

There are two washing machine and two tumble dryers. They are stacked and are front loading.

Recreational Areas

There is no indoor Recreational Area.

There is an outdoor Play Area. This is situated at the top of the site. There are benches that available near the play area. Play area surface is wood bark and has a fence around it. There are two swings, a slide, and a climbing frame. There is a grass area to the rear of the park for ball games

Waste, Water, Fire and Evacuation

Waste, Water, Fire and Evacuation.

There is flat, level access leading to the refuse area, which is situated at the site entrance. The road is gravel. There are no handrails.

The Waste Containers are 1.41m high with lift-up lids.

There is flat, level access to all water taps.

There is flat, level access to all waste points.

The site has a CDP. There is flat level access which is situated on the left of the main facility block.

There are no fire triangles on site. There is unrestricted access to the firefighting equipment.

Fire assembly points are in the lower visitor car park and by the barrier.
