About Salisbury

Salisbury is a medieval cathedral city in the southern English county of Wiltshire.

It's 9 miles south of the iconic prehistoric stone circle at Stonehenge, which stands on the grassland of Salisbury Plain.

The city's ornate 13th-century cathedral has a 123m spire, a working 14th-century clock and an original copy of the Magna Carta (the Great Charter), a key document from 1215 A.D.

Old Sarum is one of the most historically important sites in southern England. You can walk right round its mighty prehistoric outer ramparts, raised by Iron Age people in about 400 BC. At the centre, you'll find the huge Norman inner mound and ditch, founded by William the Conqueror. Climbing onto the mound, you can trace the ruins of the Norman royal castle. Around it, a bustling new city sprang up.

The camp site is situated on Hudson's Field at the foot of Old Sarum.

Salisbury has significant military connections. Some notable examples include:

Bulford Barracks: Home to the Royal Gloucestershire, Berkshire and Wiltshire Regiment and other military units.

Salisbury Plain: A major military training area, used by the British Army for manoeuvres and exercises.

Larkhill Garrison: A military base on Salisbury Plain, known for its artillery training.

The area's military presence reflects its strategic location and history.

At the top of the road, by the entrance, is the Secret Spitfires Memorial which was officially inaugurated on 9th July 2021 and is a lasting tribute to the hundreds of women and men of Salisbury who contributed to an astonishing part of the city's history by building almost 2,500 Spitfires in total secrecy.



Your Arrival on Site

Nearest train station 1.5 miles from site. Nearest bus stop 300m up the hill to Castle Rd bus stop.

There are two brown signs on the A345, one large brown sign at the entrance to Hudson's Field and a Camping & Caravanning Club sign.

There is a red and White Salisbury Club site sign as you turn right into Hudson's Field and a large Club sign on entrance to the site.

A barrier which is automatically operated between the hours of 7am-11pm. It is locked between 11pm and 7am.

Entry and exit is via the one barrier so the exit must be left clear at all times.

There is a tarmac road to the site with an area of block paving in front of the main entrance

New Arrivals should pull up at the 'New Arrival' sign located on the left before the barrier.

If expecting to arrive after 8pm please telephone the site to make arrangements with the staff for access.

Arrivals after 11pm please note there is no overnight parking area however you may park on the Rugby Club car park located on the left after you turn off Castle Road.

The drive is sloping tarmac. There is no designated accessible parking.

There are no handrails leading to reception.

There is a slight to moderate incline to reception, no steps.

There is a green fence to the side of the path leading to reception and gravel boarder.



Your Check In

Reception is clearly signed for arrivals.

Minimum hours for Reception are 9am to 10:30am and 4pm to 6pm

Reception may be open longer at peak periods and during high season.

Out of hours go to Reception and follow the instructions posted on the door. 11pm to 7am for 999 emergencies call the emergency service required then alert site staff by phoning the site mobile, number is on reception door.

There is a slight to moderate incline to reception. There is a slight lip on door frame.

There is good clear floor space but there is a mat on the floor.

There are shelves and fridges around the perimeter of the reception room.



Your Pitch

Most pitches accommodate a car next to the camper's unit.

There are 34 hardstanding's within 100m or closer to the facility block.

The hardstanding's are all gravel.

Hardstanding and grass serviced pitches near the facilities are mainly level.

We are a slightly sloping site and recommend that you bring levelling blocks as we cannot always guarantee a level pitch.



Travelling Around Site

There are no speed bumps on site.

Some pitch areas are lit by the lighting on the electrical bollards. Some pitch areas are unlit.

The facility blocks and reception are lit all night by external lights on sensors.

The main entrance gate and refuse area are lit overnight by a sensor when approached.



The Facility Block

The facility blocks have level paving slabs around them.

There are no steps or ramps leading to the facility blocks.

The access to the facility block is level. There is no semi ambulant cubicle in the main block. However, there is an accessible room on the second block.

Most taps in the facility blocks have push buttons.

The main showers are push button. All showers are level access, with a slight slope to the drain.

The facility blocks are lit at night.

There are indoor washing up facilities. The washing up sinks have lever taps.



The Accessible Facilities

There are level paving slabs from the tarmac road to the accessible facility.

There are no handrails to the accessible facility.

There is flat level access to the accessible facility.

The toilet has handrails. The toilet has a large flush handle.

There is a transfer space to the left of the toilet.

The wash basin can be reached from the toilet.

The wash basin has lever taps. There is a hand dryer.

There is a full length mirror. The shower has handrails. The shower is dial operated.

The shower is open access. The shower head is height adjustable.

The floor is non slip. There is no hair dryer.

The emergency cord can be reached from the floor. The alarm can only be heard on the nearest staff pitch. The alarm cannot be heard at reception.



Laundry & Information Room

The access to the laundry and information room is level.

The path is level paving slabs.

The taps are lever taps.

The washing machine and tumble dryer are front loading and can be loaded from the floor. The tumble dryer is not stacked.

There is a wall mounted iron and freestanding ironing board.

There is a wall mounted defibrillator.



Recreational Areas

There is no indoor recreation area.

There is no children's play area.

The campsite is adjacent to Hudson's Field where there is ample space for children to play ball games etc.



Waste, Water, Fire and Evacuation

The access to the refuse area is sloping.

The access is plastic mats in filled with gravel.

There is no step or kerb. There are no handrails.

The lids of the waste containers are approximately 1.4m off the ground.

There are three fire triangles on site. There is unrestricted access to the firefighting equipment.

The first Evacuation Point on Site is located at the Motor Home Service point – This is Assembly Point 1

The second Evacuation Point on Site is located at the back of the bin compound. This can be found through the Exit barrier and turn immediately right. – This is Assembly Point 2

In addition to the defibrillator on site there is also one located on the wall by the front door of the sports pavilion before the entrance to the site.
