## About Slingsby

Slingsby campsite is located between the North Yorkshire Moors National Park and the Howardian Hills.

The site is flat and generally open with some mature trees. The 55 pitch site offers a mix of hardstanding with electric and grass with electric pitches.

The ground is especially hard so steel pegs are required.

Mobile signal is poor, there is a pay phone on site. Television signal is good.



### Your Arrival on Site

The earliest arrival time on site is strictly 1pm. Anyone arriving before this time will be asked to return later to avoid congestion occurring on the approach road to site.

Approach surface is tarmac. The site is signed with brown tourist signs with the large white Camping and Caravanning Club sign at the entrance.

Arrival surface is level tarmac, with a stop sign in front of reception.

There is an automatic barrier with key pad number code. When the barriers are locked, there is a small 3 car carpark just outside the barriers with pedestrian access.

No further visitor parking is available on site.

There is no designated accessible parking.

There is a bus stop 800m from site with buses to Malton and Hovingham.

There is a railway station at Malton, 7 miles from site.

Accessible taxis can be booked in advance on 01653 696969.



### Your Check In

The Reception Block is the building on the left just ahead of the barrier.

The Reception is clearly signed.

Access to Reception is level.

There is a small 5mm threshold into reception. There is a wide doorway, and the door opens inwards. The floor space is free from clutter and there is turning room for wheelchairs.

The reception is open from 9am but may often be unmanned when staff are working on site.

The latest assisted pitching is 8pm, for assistance until this time please use the reception doorbell. Staff are not on duty after 8.00pm,

For blue light emergencies after 8pm please use reception doorbell or the emergency phone number which is displayed on the reception door.

Details of local hospitals, doctors, dentists and vets can be found on the noticeboard outside reception and in the Site Welcome Leaflet.



### Your Pitch

Hardstanding with electric and grass with electric pitches are available close to the facility block, including accessible facilities.

All pitches are level.

Campers can park on the left hand side of their pitch, next to their unit. There is a limit of 1 car per pitch. Additional vehicles can park in the visitor parking, space permitting.



### Travelling Around Site

All site roads are tarmac or gravel. There is a speed limit around the site of 5mph and there are speed bumps. A one way system is in operation, and this is clearly signed.

Majority of the footpaths throughout the site are paved or tarmac. There are no handrails on any footpaths.

There is low level lighting on the outside of all blocks and the rest of the site is dimly lit by bollard

lights. A torch is recommended when walking around the site at night.

There may be raised tree roots in the wooded areas of the site.



### The Facility Block

There is a clear, well maintained path leading to the facility block.

There are no steps on the pathway.

There is a gentle ramp leading to the block.

There is one 22cm step at all entrances to the toilets and showers.

The taps are push taps.

The showers are push button and temperatures are preset for safety.

There are no steps in the showers. There is a free standing seat in each shower cubicle.

The facility block and access are well lit at night.

There is no turning room in the main facilities block for wheelchairs. There are no accessible cubicles.

Assistance dogs are permitted in the facility block.

There is a covered, outdoor dish washing area with three sinks.

These have push type taps.

There are no low level sinks in the dish washing area.



## The Accessible Facilities

There is flat level access leading to the accessible facilities, which is in the main facility block, having its own door opening directly onto the pathway.

There are no handrails leading to the facility.

The door has an 850mm opening width and opens outwards. There is a 5mm lip on the threshold.

There are no grab rails by the door. The facilities are accessed via a door using a RADAR key. There is a pull handle on the door.

The taps are lever mixers.

The shower is open access, flat wet room style with no tray to step into. The shower has two grab rails and a pull-down seat, capable of taking a weight up to 95 kgs. The shower is twist operated and the shower head is height adjustable.

The toilet has a drop down handrail on one side. The toilet has a regular size flush handle. There is transfer space one side of the toilet when handrails are lifted. There is a hand dryer and the washbasin can be reached from the toilet.

The floor is non-slip.

There is an emergency cord by the toilet and one by the shower. Both can be reached from the floor. The alarm can be heard from the staff pitches and Reception.

Assistance dogs are permitted in the facility block.

### Laundry & Food Preparation Areas

These areas have good level access and are in the main facility block. There are no handrails leading to the laundry area or within the area. There is wheelchair turning room in the laundry. The door to the laundry area opens outwards.

The taps are push type.

There are two sinks 1m high, there are no low level sinks in the laundry area.

There are 2 laundry sinks, one washing machine and one tumble dryer. The washer and dryer are.

front loading and can be reached from the floor. There is a wall mounted iron and a free-standing ironing board



### Recreational Areas

There is no indoor Recreational Area.

There is no outdoor Play Area.



### Waste, Water, Fire and Evacuation

There is flat, level access leading to the refuse area, which is situated near the exit barrier. The path is concrete flagstones and tarmac. There are no hand rails.

The Waste Containers are 1.5m high with large lift up lids.

There is flat, level access to all water taps. There is flat, level access to all waste points.

The site has a CDP. There is flat level access which is situated in the main facility block. There is a

small 5mm threshold. The door to the CDP opens outwards. There is a hand sanitiser dispenser

outside the CDP.

There are fire triangles on site. There is unrestricted access to the firefighting equipment.
