## What our campers say....

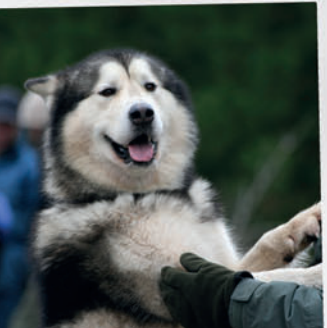
