This walk from the Dartmouth Club Site takes you on a beautiful coastal walk with views across the sea to Dartmouth. The highlight is Sugary beach cove which is tucked into a nook in the wooded cliffs. Points of interest: Coastal Views Sugary Cove

Description





A three-hour walk from the Dartmouth Club Site on Lanes, Paths and Tracks. Steep steps down to Sugary Cove.

1. Start

From Dartmouth Club Site turn R on pavement.



2. 0.48km/0.3 miles

At Coast Path signpost turn L, proceed down Redlap Lane.



3. 1.61km/1.0 miles

At T junction, turn R in approx 10 yds, following the Coast Path sign through National Trust (Little Dartmouth) car park.





4. 4.02km/2.5 miles

Follow path, through wooden gates, staying on grassy path. Through gap in stone wall, take L path at fork. Follow coast path as it bends before descending down hill to finger post.



5. 4.98km/3.1 miles

Veer L following signpost Coast Path - Dartmouth, through wooden gate continue on path through ferns and woodland to Castle Road.



6. 5.15km/3.2 miles

Turn R at Compass Cottage for five yards, turn R at signpost Coast Path. Path bends slight R continue through woodland descending stone steps which zigzag, eventually leading to signpost on R and steps down to Sugary Cove.





7. 5.79km/3.6 miles

Return by the same path to T junction with Castle Road. At Compass Cottage turn L. Sign post – Public Bridleway – Little Dartmouth. Continue on road through wooden gates, straight on past cottages on L. Through wooden gate following grassy path (National Trust – Little Dartmouth).



8. **6.76km/4.2 miles** Through wooden gates.



9. **7.08km/4.4 miles** Continue on path past National Trust car park, signposted Stoke Fleming.





Proceed up Redlap Lane to Dartmouth Road, turn R. Walk back on pavement to Dartmouth Club Site on L.
