

## Chichester Club Site

### Emsworth Harbour walk

#### Route Summary



A delightful four-mile walk from Chichester Camping and Caravanning Club Site around the nearby marshes and harbours to Emsworth, returning via Southbourne.

#### Description



A delightful four-mile walk from Chichester Camping and Caravanning Club Site around the nearby marshes and

harbours to Emsworth, returning via Southbourne.

The route heads south out of the Club Site, and immediately brings walkers into contact with the wild-feeling marshland and sand flats characterising the inlets along this stretch of coastline.

It rounds Thornley Marina, before heading west towards Emsworth, where stunning views across the harbour are possible on a bright clear day.

Walkers return to the Club Site via the A259, offering a good number of potential refreshment stops, and lastly passing through Southbourne to end back at your pitch.

## Waypoints

---

**1** (50.84471; -0.90297)

Turn right out of the site and cross the road when you see the stile.

**2** (50.84473; -0.90342)

Cross the road and climb over the stile. Follow the path until you get to a crossroads.

**3** (50.84282; -0.90376)

At the end of the lane turn right. Follow the path until you reach the kissing gate and then go through it. Follow the path around the field until you reach the top, go along the small track to the right and you will see the sea.

**4** **Prinstead Head**

(50.83953; -0.90945)



Continue on this track until you reach the Sailing Club House at Prinstead Head. There are seats here for you to take a rest.

**S** (50.84004; -0.91372)



From the sailing club go left, which will take you on to Thorney Island, passing Thornham Marina.

## 6 Thornham Marina

(50.83500; -0.91514)



Turn right just past the marina and the path leads out on to a wide but quiet access road.

## 7 Blue Whales

(50.83416; -0.91769)



Turn right onto the wide access road and follow this past the sewage works, on to Emsworth Marina. Look out for the blue whales!

## 8 Emsworth Marina

(50.83906; -0.92696)



Turn left and follow the path through the marina.

## 9 (50.84392; -0.93066)

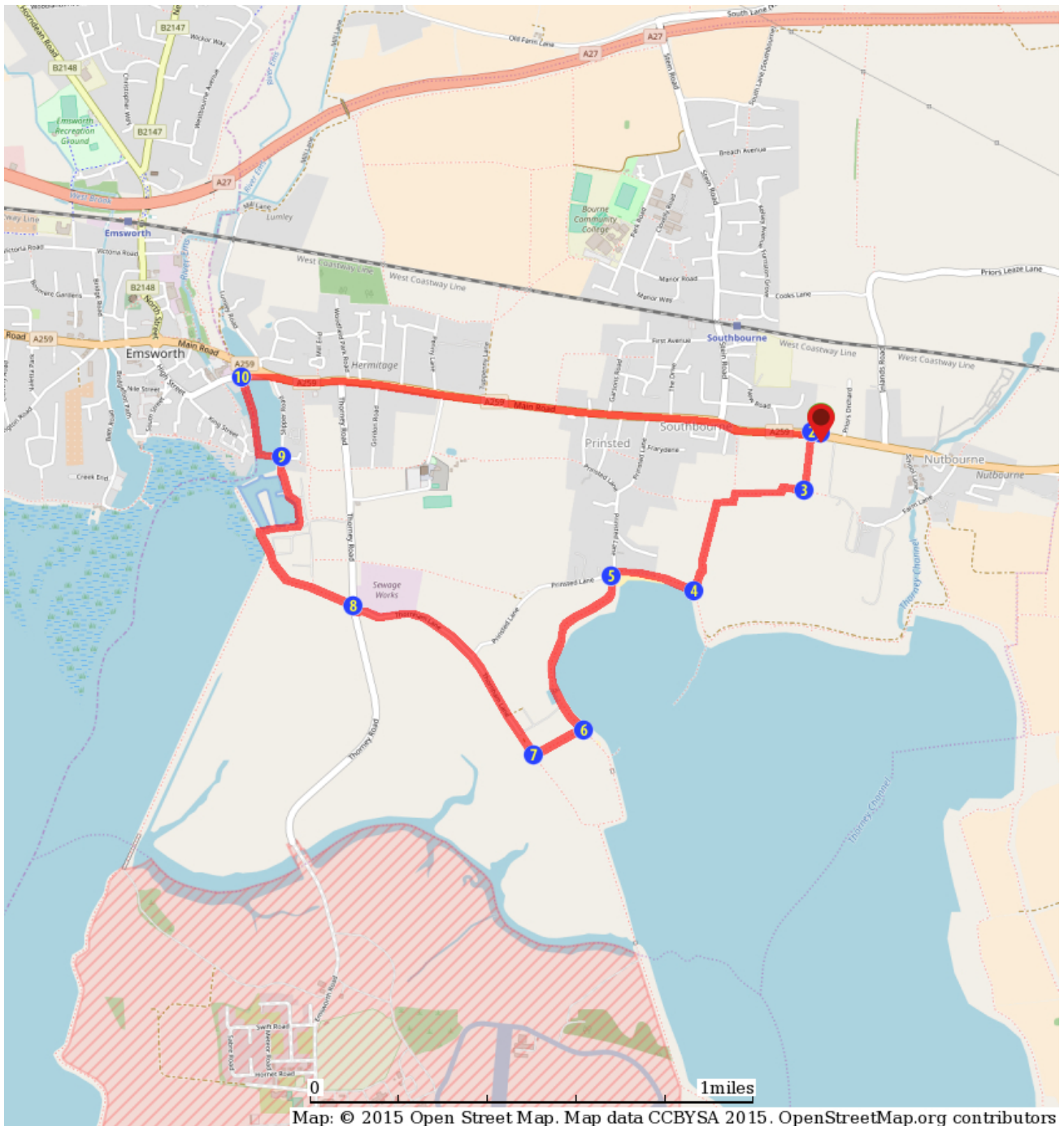
Cross the causeway and you are now in Emsworth, where you will find a selection of pubs, restaurants, cafés and shops.

## 10 Emsworth and return

(50.84655; -0.93271)

You can walk back to Chichester Club Site along the footpath that follows the A259 in an easterly direction. If you are feeling a little tired, there are local buses that can take you back to the site.
