2018 Tent Owner Satisfaction Awards update

Our definition: Here we're looking at tents that were sold for anything between £300 and £1,000. That means a broad spectrum in the middle of the market. It's also where larger, weekender and family-size tents are more to the fore.

It's nearly all change at the top here because, although Hi Gear maintained its position as the second favourite

mainstream brand, slots one and three were taken by new names – Vango at the top and Quechua in third, pushing last year's third place winner Outwell just outside the top three.

In fact, with a sample sizes limiting this category to four names, Outwell can console itself with the fact that it garnered a greater total response than the others, and its 88% score was just 1% less than third-placed Quechua. Also, fewer than half of all Outwell models in its extensive family tent portfolio would normally fall into the £300-£1,000 price range.
